It is no surprise that Bellator Christi is a ministry wholly devoted to apologetics. From our podcasts, articles, and forthcoming books, the intellectual life is emphasized. Emotions are important, but they can lead us

astray when left unchecked. Karen Swallow Prior warns that sentimentalism can become dangerous when "emotions are evoked apart from or subordinate to other aspects of the human experience (such as intellectual, spiritual, or physical experience) and the totality of what is real (Prior, 128).

Yet emotions and experiences are critical to the total life of the believer as well. Emotions without reason lead to mindless sentimentalism, whereas reason without emotion leads to Stoicism. Pastoral apologetics tends to both the emotional and intellectual life of the believer.

The power of pastoral apologetics is especially seen in the realm of hospice ministry. When people face the most tragic of circumstances, they cannot rely on their emotions alone, especially seeing that their emotions are on a wild roller coaster of a ride. Apologetics can help a person find the anchor they need amid the storms of life. Yet, on the other hand, sympathy and empathy are needed to offer effective counsel to a person in need. Place the two together and you have pastoral apologetics. This style offers a one-two punch that other methods cannot afford. The mind and heart are two parts that constitute the whole of humanity. Let's not either one in our attempts to minister to others in need. Pastoral apologetics can serve as a safeguard for the believer in all manners of doubt that may come (Gentry, *Pulpit Apologetics*, 14–16) and offers a more robust method of ministry.

From the Executive VP's Desk

Titles and subtitles

I love physical books! They are my favorite for several reasons— the feel of each page of paper between my fingers as I turn from one to the next and the ability to highlight and make notes that don't disappear to cyberland. While those are my preferences, a great deal of my reading now takes place online and a majority

of that reading consists of articles, not unlike those on BellatorChristi.com. In addition to our topic and the contents of our articles, we must also consider the readability of our material when it is in electronic form.

There are a few things we can consider that will make our articles easier to read electronically. In a previous newsletter, we considered the importance of the length of sentences, paragraphs, and the overall article. Here I would like to encourage you to consider the title and section subtitles. The title of the article is a quick glimpse into its content. Think about your own scrolling experience. How quickly do you decide to stop and read an article or keep moving to the next one? Does the title grab your attention? Does the article introduce a keyword to the article's subject? When writing your article, craft a title that gets to the point and will make your reader stop.

The section titles should also include a keyword that ties to the article as a whole and points to the section specifically. Once the reader is engaged, section titles also provide a kind of road map. Think about your own online reading experience. If it's like mine, it is often small increments of time, frequently interrupted—often due to the fact I'm using my phone and standing in line or filling a small fragment of time. Section titles help me re-engage when I return to the article, and it reminds me where I was and where I'm going. When writing your article, include section titles that will help your online reader stay connected and get to the message you intended to convey.

The Pastor Apologist

Do, ask, pray

I have three requests of you, friends. I would like some of you to *do* something, some of you to *ask for* something, and all of you to *pray for* something. What are the somethings? I'll give you a hint: they all have to do with the title of my column. As you just saw in looking to the top of this article, my column is entitled, "Pastor Apologist." So, in keeping with my column's focus, here are the somethings I have in mind.

If you're a pastor, I'm asking you to make it a priority to include apologetics in your preaching. Before you say, "I can't," I ask you, "Why not?" Apologetics is at the heart of all you say in the pulpit, even if you don't realize it. When you preach for holiness, you give reasons for holiness. When you preach for unity, you give reasons for unity. When you preach for conversion, you give reasons for conversion. All those reasons you give are proof of the apologetic content that infuses your ministry. If you're with me thus far, then you'll see that I'm not asking for something new or unattainable. I'm asking you to remember that we have a reasonable faith—one that speaks to the heart and mind—and we have good reasons for that faith. Your people need to hear those reasons at every turn of the homiletical wheel, be it turning for discipleship or evangelism. Pastor, I'm asking you to do the work of the pulpit apologist God calls you to be.

If you're not a pastor, then I assume you have one, and here's my ask of you: I'm asking you to go to your pastor and ask him to make apologetics a priority in his preaching. Though I'm not intending that the congregation seeks to dictate what is said in the pulpit, I do know that my ears are attentive to the concerns of those I pastor. Your pastor's ears are also listening to your concerns. Don't be afraid to voice them. Be tactful, respectful, and genuine, but make sure you ask your pastor to proclaim the *what* and the *why* of the full counsel of God. Faithful church member, I'm asking you to ask your pastor to be the apologist God calls him to be.

I'm asking all of you—pastors and those under their care—to pray that God will raise up churches with apologetics at the heart of their mission to seekers and saints. All of us can pray, and all of us should pray specifically. We have a dire need for strong churches that can clearly, lovingly, and passionately proclaim and defend the precious deposit of the gospel. God is listening, and I believe He will respond to the prayers of His people when they call on Him to raise up strong, gospel-centered, apologetically sound churches. I'm asking all of us to raise our voices to heaven with fervent prayers to strengthen existing churches and spark new ones with a heart for apologetics.

Will you do, ask, and pray?

Advancing gospel conversations

Would you like to advance gospel conversations? Do you feel hindered by feeling ill-equipped? *Listening* and *questioning* are two helpful skills in any conversation. It has been said, "Being heard is so close to being loved that for the average person,

they are almost indistinguishable." In addition, asking questions stimulates the brain and cultivates better thinking. By following the example of Jesus, these strategies can further gospel conversations.

These two skills are a pattern of Jesus. In Luke, the reader sees Jesus as a youth in the temple, "sitting in the midst of the teachers, both listening to them and asking them questions" (Luke 2:46). The first observation is that Jesus was listening to the conversation to understand their thinking. He then responded with good questions. These questions stimulated a dialogue that revealed truths. Luke notes in the next verse that "All who heard Him were amazed at His understanding and His answers" (Luke 2:47). Listening can enable the ability to understand issues and respond with good questions that can lead to revealing truths or exposing errors.

Listening and questioning are helpful skills to advance the gospel. Listening demonstrates value to individuals and helps the hearer understand the person's beliefs. Asking questions helps the listener self-reflect on their beliefs. Questioners should consider allowing time for the hearer to answer, even up to eight seconds. Listening and questioning can cultivate the conversation to show love, reveal truth, and expose errors to advance the gospel.



New Publications from Bellator Christi Team Members

Dr. Sherene Khouri—*Triune Relationality: A Trinitarian Response to Islamic Monotheism* (November 19, 2024—IVP Academic).



Dr. Sherene Khouri launches her first solo book project with IVP Academic. Sherene Nicholas Khouri offers both historical and constructive responses to Islamic objections to the doctrine of the Trinity. Khouri considers arguments from Arabic Christian theologians and philosophers in the eighth to tenth centuries, primarily John of Damascus, Theodore Abū Qurrah, and Yaḥyā Ibn cAdī.

When Muslims expanded beyond the Arabic peninsula, Christians in occupied regions were spurred to defend the Trinity against the Islamic understanding of tawhid, the absolute oneness of Allah, and against misconceptions of Christian belief.

Khouri then applies the insights of these little-known thinkers to current theology and apologetics conversations. She makes the case for appealing to the common ground of God as the greatest conceived being, then arguing that such a being must be relational in nature. While Christians today debate models of the Trinity with each other and with Muslims, they can be confident that Christians throughout history have believed in triune relationality and found in the doctrine of the Trinity an invitation to personal relationship with the divine.
